**Timeline:**

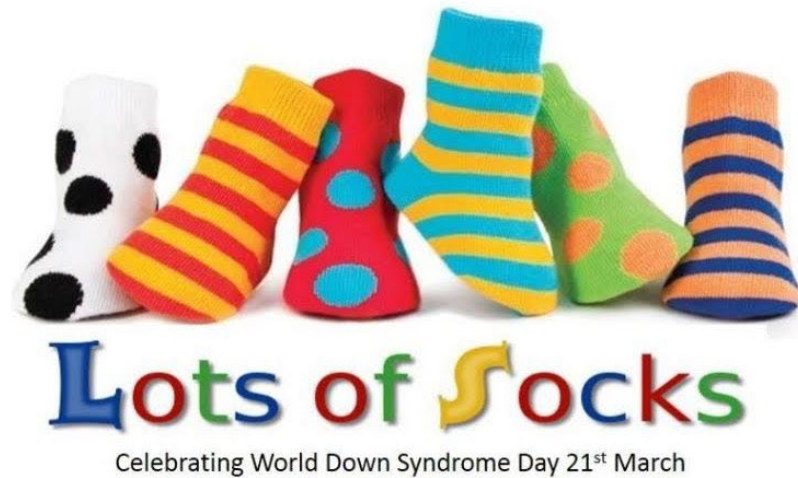
March 18 – 22 – All students are invited to donate gently used books for the sale.
