

## What is Online Safety?

As your child explores the online world, it's important to teach them how to stay safe and responsible. Online safety means helping them understand how to act kindly, protect their personal information, and recognize what is appropriate to share.



## Online Safety Tips for Parents

### **Teach Personal Safety:**

• Explain to your child the importance of not sharing personal information online, such as their full name, address, or school. Use simple language and relatable examples to help them understand why privacy is important.

#### **Promote Kindness:**

• Encourage your child to practice kindness and respect when communicating online. Discuss how online interactions should mirror their behavior in person and remind them to think before they type.

#### **Set Clear Boundaries:**

• Establish specific rules for screen time and online activities. Make sure these rules are easy for your child to understand and enforce them consistently. Regularly review the apps and websites they are using to ensure they are age-appropriate.
